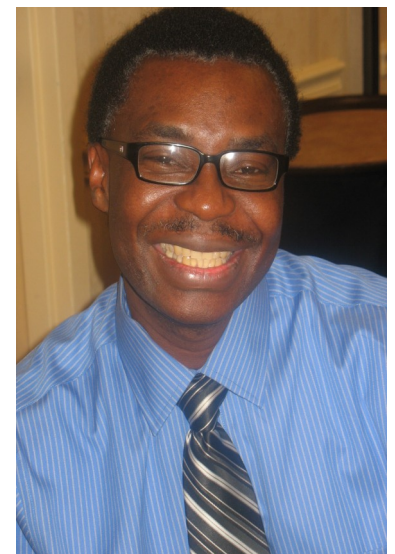

BENIN REPUBLIC REPORT ... Chuks and Rose Ogbonna

February 16, 2010 - Mission to Yimporima.

Pastor Chuks Ogbonna reports: "The outreach to Yimporima was very successful. Everyone of us determined that nothing will stop it. We had to trek 10 kilometers, even pregnant mothers.

It is the best so far in Republic of Benin. Pastors from other denominations attended. God granted us favor before a school master who allowed us to stay in a very big classroom for this occasion.

We dwelt on the theme: The Authority of the Risen Christ. It was indeed wonderful. After the program, one of our guest called me and said he has seen that it is only God's work that interest me; so he is going to pay for the rent of the Church for 1 year beginning from now.

We are again encouraged by the promise. To God be the glory."

September 4, 2010 - Delivered From Sudden Death

"Thank God with us for the deliverance He granted us last night. We bought some maize in the market yesterday not knowing that it contained some toxic substances.

We'd almost eaten it but God kept us back using a co-tenant who teaches in the college of agriculture. According to him, this kind of food has resulted in death of so many who ignorantly ate it.

A brother lent us the money of which we needed to reimburse. In the night, our house would have been set ablaze due to kerosene containing fuel, when we wanted to light the lamp it caught fire. Yes God has once again shown us His mercy. We give Him thanks."

Chad Republic - Pastors Ejike and Faith Mbaekwe

Our missionaries in Chad Republic, Pastors Ejike and Faith Mbaekwe and their children have been posted back to Nigeria to help in the Millions For Christ Theological Missionary Institute. On October 7, 2010,

Pastor Ejike wrote: "The movement on the lake is quite a risk. This is the only means of traveling for researching the remote areas that are isolated from contemporary society. Millions for Christ is the only missions minded organization covering that vast area with limited resource for the past 15 years.

We have an uncompleted church building in one of the islands on the lake which is predominantly Muslims. In spite of Islamic hostility, we have been witnessing to those communities and two strong

churches are standing in Kan-galam and Chikundu to prove what God has done. More areas are being targeted." There is a dire need to build a church across the river (Cikin-Kud) as the brethren fellowship in a shack.

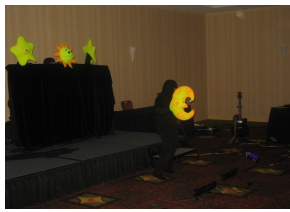


The Nwoji's Family

Testimonies From the Office in MFCM Office in Nigeria Ikpele Church In Obeagu:

There used to be no church at all in Ikpele of Obeagu. The villagers were even proud of it, they would tell preachers to move away or else their stories will be like the others that left. Pastor Victor Nwoji was among the group that went to that land with the Students Missions Advance of the Millions For Christ Mission some years back.

It was as though their effort in that outreach was futile. The villagers did not listen as such and brethren were not that encouraged. But again God has put smiles on our faces. Daddy Egbeaso started a bible study centre in that same land which has turned into a church.

The first time a service held in that land, the villagers ran out to be sure it was in their land the church service was being held. Now in that land, there are about 21 adults in the church and 12 children.

The amazing thing is the rate of growth of the church and the consciousness of God is aroused in that land. Last week, they gave their pastor a bottle of malt, five painters of garri, two cups of

egwusi and one cup of ogbono without any request from their pastor. They are growing as well. Praise God.

Ohubo/Okpaligbo:

Another chief priest has given his life to the lord. He requested to be baptized after giving his life to Jesus. He was at the burial of a former chief priest who died in the lord after a crusade from some CASOR students in UNEC last year.

He was so astonished at the presence of God and dignity that was accorded the former chief priest at the burial that he ran and decided to give his life to the lord. He said when he dies, he would want to be buried like his friend who died knowing Jesus. So he has renounced his idol worship and is requesting to be baptized. Hallelujah. Sister Janet Eze was also delivered from Alcoholism in Ohubo church.

This has been a problem to the church as almost all the members drink. But with the deliverance of that sister, there was a massive turn out of member to also declare that were free from that and that they will not move into that again.

Jioke Church

There were divisions

and members were not interested in coming to church again. Pastor Ejike, our missionary from Chad volunteered to be going there for now to help out in the work since the pastor was suspended. Now there is a massive growth and the lord has revived that church. Check out the following:

1. Open door of one convert per month
2. Restoring joint fellowship with Amezu church which was severed since this year.
3. The women initiated a program "Enlargement campaign" in the community through evangelism and communal incentives among members
4. Introducing adult literacy program to enable adults to read the Bible. Bro Sunday, the native leader is using his "teaching practice to organize the scheme
5. The native leader is planning to run a temporary nursery education program.

Prayer points:

Flooding:

There is alarming disaster that has hit the world at large this season: Flooding. We hear the reports from

every part of the world; China, Pakistan, India, Sokoto of Nigera etc. Now our fields are not left out.

In **Dhubo**, so many farmland have been destroyed, and some propertis as well. Some homes have fallen down and there is great fear in the villages. They said this has never happened since any of them was born.

In **ogbebu**, people cannot leave their home because the only bridge that that will lead people out have been overflown with water. In fact the bridge is damaged and people cannot move.

The church premises in **Dhubo** was affected and some members lost their homes. The weekly activities now hold in pastor vera's house which is also about to fall. Pleas pray that God will intervene in all these.

A bike for pastor Basil. A new field was started by our Students Mission Advance branch of Ebonyi State University. The field is about one and half hours trek from any where the vehicle will stop you. Pastor Basil who is also the pastor of Amezu church needs a bike to meet the schedules of the two churches now. Pleas pray that lord will make it available for him.

Funds for Building:

There are building projects to be completed in Ubahu Ndi-agu Etit, Jioke, Enugu, Ubahu, Umualor, Egbebelu, Ugwuafor, and Ikpele. Please pray that more funds will come in to give a roof over the heads of these villagers who are so thirsty to serve God.

Pastor Nnamdi Graduates From Asian Theological Seminary with the Most Prestigious Award
Pastor Nnamdi Ikpe served as our first Nigerian Director, and then moved to Philippines to head our Asian Mission. To understand the culture of the people and to further his studies, he got enrolled into the Asian Theological Seminary. He graduated this year with 4 Awards: The Faculty Award (The Most Prestigious Award), the Academic Excellence Award (the Second Most Coveted), the Biblical/Exegetical Award, and the Cross-Cultural Missions Award. Below is the testimony of the ATS about Pastor Nnamdi Ikpe:

"As an ATS student, Nnamdi remained focused in his studies. He always sat in the same spot in the Library with his laptop computer. Whenever he was not busy with his studies, you would see him at the ATS International Students (ATSIS) office to which he was elected to serve for two consecutive years - first as secretary and then a chairman. On week-ends, Nnamdi busied himself in church ministry in Montalban where he led Bible studies and coordinated the mission team."

Pastor Nnamdi got engaged to Sister Meriam Bongato while in the Seminary. Today, they are married and are planning strategies for fulfilling God's vision for the Millions for Christ Mission in Asia. We have been discussing of many mission opportunities in Cambodia and the Philippines. We will likely concentrate on training up leaders who will be sent to different parts of the Asian continent.

We have 4 of our children in Philippines also: 3 Females and 1 male. The 3 ladies are studying midwifery to continue into Nursing and the boy is reading Pre-Med specializing in Physiotherapy.

Despite financial lack and other issues, they have been able to go through their first year, and are now in their second year. We hope that they will work with Pastor Nnamdi to continue the work there.

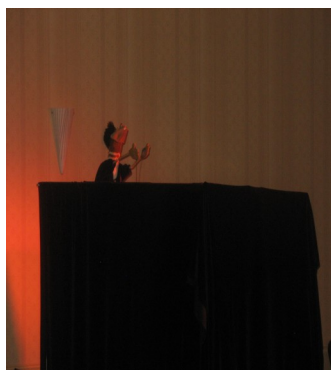


Roberto Maranhao International Puppet Ministry came to celebrate with us. They made sure that both children and adults alike were ministered to through puppets,

This year, we will have 12 "Prayer for the Nations" sessions. We have already had the January session. Our venue is the Hilton Garden Inn, White Marsh, Nottingham, Baltimore, Maryland 21236.

At the January session, we brought every continent before God who is the owner of all people and the Creator of all that is in the world. We believe firmly that as we call on God day and night con-

cerning the nations that He will begin a global revival that would sweep across the nations. The time is ripe for such a revival. Nations are tribulating; people are seeking for answers, and there has never been a greater opportunity to share the good news than there is now.

ARE YOU WONDERING HOW TO BE INVOLVED IN MISSIONS THROUGH THE MILLIONS FOR CHRIST MISSIONS? THIS IS HOW

Millions For Christ Missions is a good body or system that can help you get involved in God's eternal missionary program for the nations. The MFCM works in totally unreached places. When you get involved with the mission, you are certain that you are expanding the kingdom of God and not duplicating efforts. You are taken to those people that really need your services.

There are many ways an individual Christian or Group can be involved in missions through the Millions For Christ Missions

1. **Be a Prayer-Partner.** Prayer partners receive prayer bulletins, and have regular prayer meetings with the mission either face-to-face or by telephone.
2. **Be a Financial/Material Supporter.** You can be involved by being a financial supporter. Financial supporters adopt a missionary or a project and regularly support the missionary or project until vision is fulfilled.
3. **Be a Short-Term Missionary.** Short Term Missionaries go to MFCM mission fields for a short period ranging from 1 week to 6 months. The MFCM will train
4. **Be a Tent-Making Missionary.** Tent-making missionaries serve God through the MFCM among unreached peoples using their professions. We believe in MFCM that your skills and professions are given by the Lord for the furtherance of the gospel.
5. **Form a Local Chapter of the MFCM where you are.** Supporters of the Millions For Christ Missions can start a local chapter where they are to help disciple people and support the work of mission.
